### Course Introduction:

2 Year A-Level Course. Fine Art A-Level gives you the freedom to develop your style and talent; whilst learning new techniques and approaches.

### Description:

#### You will study the following:

Painting and drawing

Printmaking

Lens-based image making

By working across disciplines, you will extend your understanding of the scope of Fine Art; focusing on one discipline, gaining a deeper understanding of specific processes within Fine Art.

### Course Suitable For:

Students who want to explore a wide range of ideas and develop skills in drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking and contextual studies. You will learn about contemporary artists and develop your critical thinking and personal responses.

### Why Study?

You will develop practical and theoretical knowledge and understanding of:

Relevant materials, processes, technologies and resources.

How ideas, feelings and meanings can be conveyed and interpreted in images and artefacts.

How images and artefacts relate to the time and place in which they were made and to their social and cultural contexts.

Continuity and change in different genres, styles and traditions.

A working vocabulary and specialist terminology.

### Progression Opportunities:

A Fine Art A-Level can help forge careers in animation, illustration, and product/ fashion design. It can also assist with careers in the media, film and television, marketing and textile industries.

## Modules:

### Component 1: Personal investigation

You will produce practical portfolios with supporting contextual research, you will be expected to develop a personal response based on a centre-set or learner-set theme leading to a finished realisation. You should carefully **select, organise** and **present** work to ensure all four assessment objectives are covered.

### Component 2: Externally Set Task

You will be provided with an examination paper on **1 February of Year 13**. You will be required to provide evidence of all the assessment objectives in response to a chosen starting point.

**You will complete an Art piece in a supervised time of 15 hours**

### Related Study

You will demonstrate your ability to communicate knowledge and understanding of art movements, genres, practitioners through a written and where appropriate illustrated component. The written study should be related to the theme of your practical portfolio, it should be guided to a minimum of 1000 words.

### Component 1: Portfolio

- A** Portfolio of practical work showing learners personal response to starting points.
- B** Related study minimum of 1000 words. No time limit

### Component 2: Externally Set Task

Pre-release 1 February - Themes

Preparatory period + 15 hours supervised time.

Students are assessed on four different assessment objectives, each worth a quarter of the final grade. Both components are assessed by the teacher and externally moderated.
